- Hawaii Japanese Center

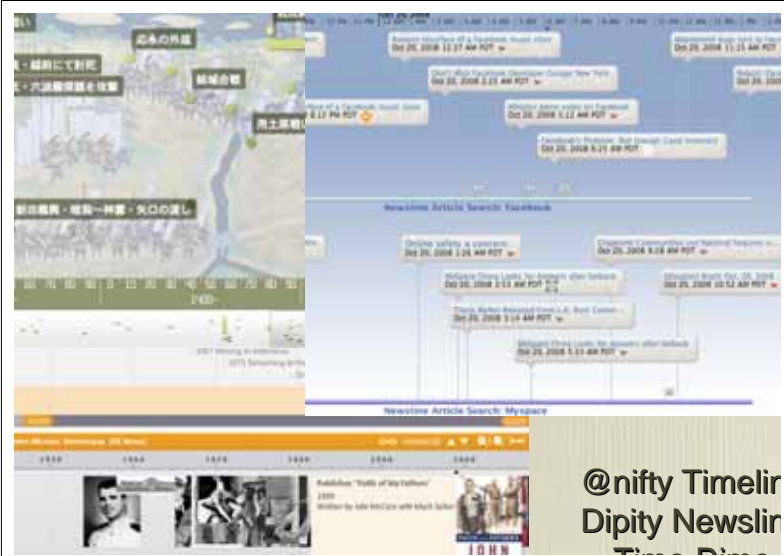


What I have learned
