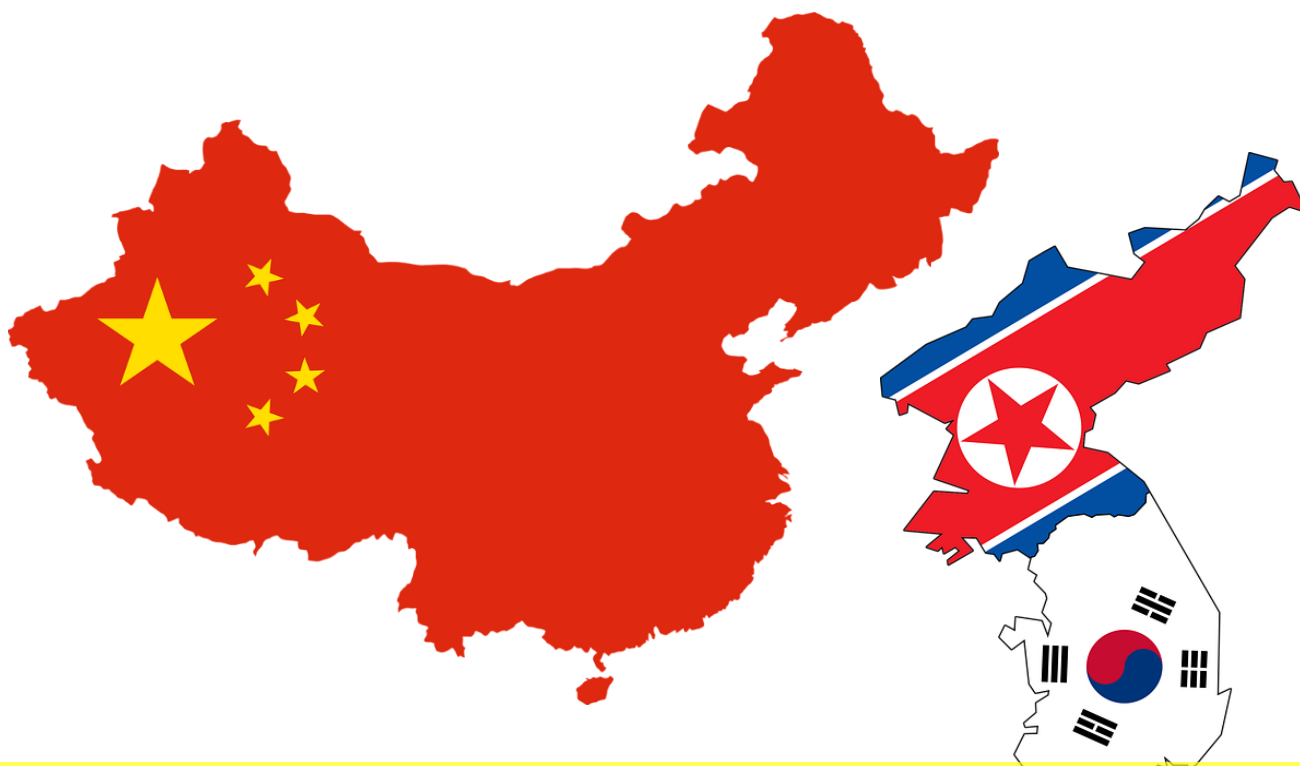

Dr Jinwook Choi is currently a visiting research fellow at the Institute for International and Area Studies, Ritsumeikan University, Kyoto. He was the 14th President of the Korea Institute for National Unification (KINU), from March 2014 to March 2017, which is a major ROK government think tank. He joined KINU as research fellow in 1993, and has studied various research topics with regard to Korean unification, North Korea and Northeast Asian security. He has been active in policy advice for ROK government as well as in academic research. He was President of the Korea Association for North Korean Studies (KANKS) in 2013, and served as a member of various advisory committees of ROK government including Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Ministry of Unification. He is the author of two books and more than 100 research papers (research monographs, book chapters and journal articles), including KINU's unifications forum series such as *Korean Unification and a New East Asian Order*(2012), *US-China Relations and Korean Unification*(2011), *Korean Unification and the Neighboring Powers* (2010). Dr. Choi received his Ph.D. in political science from the University of Cincinnati in 1992.
