講義分野	<p>Human Rights, Asia Pacific, International Law, Constitutions, United Nations, International Organizations</p> <p>当フィールドの設定は、関心のある分野に該当する科目を検索、閲覧するものです。興味のある分野を示しているだけであって、卒業に必要な単位区分とは関係がありません。単位区分については、ハンドブックを参照の上、履修するようにしてください。</p>
履修の目安	<p>This course is open to 3rd-year or 4th-year students who are interested in human rights law and practices in Asia Pacific. The course would be of particular interest to those who have studied international law or constitutional law.</p>
授業のねらい	<p>This course is designed to build students' knowledge of human rights law and practices with the special focus on the Asia Pacific region. As contrasted with Europe, Latin America and Africa, Asia does not yet have a regional human rights court. This means that the implementation of various human rights treaties depends largely on each state's legal systems and political climate, without systematic regional oversight and the opportunities for individuals to resort to judicial proceedings at the regional level. How does this affect the situations of human rights in the Asia Pacific region? How are the key human rights protected in various states? Should there be a regional human rights court in the future? In addressing these broad questions, this course focuses on discussing specific examples in various countries, including Japan, China, Korea, and Australia.</p>
到達目標	<p>After completion of the course, students are able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– understand and explain the major legal controversies regarding the interactions between human rights treaties and domestic legal systems, the regional human rights mechanisms in Asia, and the human rights bodies based on the UN Charter;</li> <li>– critically review some of the judicial decisions and academic writings in this field of law;</li> <li>– articulate their views of the field in a logical manner; and</li> <li>– present relevant, constructive and critical arguments during class discussion.</li> </ul>
授業方法	<p>1) Interactive classes: The course puts emphasis on class discussion. For each class, students will be provided with “discussion questions” in advance. The discussion questions are used to help students prepare for classes and contribute to class discussion in an effective manner. Each class, we discuss human rights law and practices through specific examples.</p> <p>2) News analysis: Students select a current news event and analyze from the points of view of human rights law. Students present their findings and lead a short in-class discussion of their presentation. This exercise helps students increase awareness of current news and critically think of their human rights implications. Students receive feedback from the lecturer and fellow students. Based on the feedback, students draft and finalize a short paper.</p>

成績評価方法	<p>Each student is evaluated on the basis of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Participation (25%): Participation is assessed by (i) attendance and (ii) relevant and constructive comments during class discussion.</li> <li>– Presentation (35%): Presentation will be assessed based on (i) clear and coherent structure, (ii) effective delivery of both general observations and specific examples, and (iii) clear and relevant responses to other students' comments and questions.</li> <li>– Paper (40%): The paper will be assessed based on (i) clear and coherent structure, (ii) persuasive analysis of the issues involved, (iii) originality, and (iv) the use of primary and secondary sources beyond the prescribed course materials.</li> </ul>
