履修の目安	<p>This is an introduction to emerging patterns of international crime in the age of globalization, so there are no prerequisite courses, though a knowledge of the globalization process would be useful</p>
授業概要	<p>The purpose of this course is to provide an understanding of the development of international crime in the age of globalization, without which the politics of many countries cannot be well understood. It begins with a history of international criminal networks and their development, including the Mafia, Triads and Yakuza. It continues with a survey of the kinds of criminal activity in which these groups are engaged, and ends with studies of the relationship between crime and politics in relation to smuggling, piracy, human rights and corruption.</p>
到達目標	<p>To be able to pass the course, students will be expected to master the main concepts and theories introduced in the lectures, and participate actively in the course, either through Web discussions or presentations, which may form part of the final mark for the course. The final examination will cover material from all the lectures in the course, so it is essential that students keep up with the readings as required. The final examination will consist of a mixture of multiple choice and short essay questions.</p>
授業方法	<p>The basic teaching method will be lectures, though a more informal format may be possible if the course is small. The Instruction Materials Folder for the course will contain the core readings and related material.</p>
毎回の授業の概要	<p>Lecture 1. Globalization and crime. This lecture will give an outline of the whole course, based on recent surveys of the field, and consider how the rise of information technology has helped the globalization of crime. Lecture 2. The Italian Connection. This covers the rise of the Italian Mafia and related groups, their history, their modes of operation, their spread to the United States, and their contemporary reach. Lecture 3 The Mafia in Russia. This lecture deals with the impact of the fall of the Soviet Union, and changing patterns of crime and its links with politics in the Soviet and post-Soviet states. Lecture 4. Crime in China: The Triads and others. This lecture deals with the origins and history of organized crime in China, its spread overseas with the Chinese diaspora, and the links with Hong Kong and Macau. Lecture 5. The Japanese Yakuza. This lecture deals with the history of the Yakuza, their contemporary links with politics and capitalism, and their adaptation to efforts to control their activities. Lecture 6. Smuggling. This lecture looks at the main patterns of the illegal cross-border movement of goods, efforts to control it, and the reasons why these efforts are often unsuccessful. Lecture 7. Piracy. Piracy is an ancient form of crime, and persists in parts of Southeast Asia, but it has also taken on a new lease of life in the Indian Ocean, with the collapse of the state in northeast Africa. Lecture 8. Narcotics. The trade in illegal drugs is one of the main drivers of global crime, providing it with a large proportion of its sales and capital. The origins and development of the drugs trade are examined, together with the repercussions and success of efforts to combat it. Lecture 9. Human trafficking and the sex industry. Human trafficking is another of the main businesses of organized crime, with the rising demand for unskilled labor in some countries. The rise of the sex industry and its links with prostitution and pornography will also be considered. Lecture 10. Gambling. This is illegal in many places, but is a mainstay of the economy in others, such as Las Vegas, Macau and (increasingly) Singapore. The rise of the industry and its historical links with organized crime will be discussed. Lecture 11. The arms trade and terrorism. The global trade in arms is one of the main causes of the increasing violence and militarization of global crime, together with the emergence of terrorism. The lecture looks at the organization of the trade, the origins and evolution of terrorism, and the consequences of the War on Terror. Lecture 12. Corruption. This lecture considers the links between organized crime, political corruption and the state. It will look at the ways in which particular types of crime are able to flourish under the protection of the state, and also how crime tends to move into the power vacuum created when states collapse. Lectures 13 and 14. These will be mainly devoted to student presentations on various aspects of the international crime scene, together with final questions and conclusions arising from the course.</p>
予習・復習の内容と分量	<p>Ideally students should be able to access and read through the notes for each lecture in advance, about 30 minutes per lecture.</p>
成績評価方法	<p>Final grades will be based on attendance (20%), on-line postings or presentations (30%), and final examination (50%).</p>

多文化協働学 修の実践方法	Two methods are envisaged, depending on the size of the class. The first is to start discussions threads on line on key issues to which students can contribute, and the second is to organize group presentations, bringing together students from varied cultural backgrounds. The material on this course is culturally challenging in that laws, values and cultural definitions of crime vary enormously from society to society, and collaboration in discussions and presentations should make students more aware of these differences.						
学生への要望 事項	Much of the best material in this area comes from journalism. Students are encouraged to look at press sources on line, the differences between the way global crime is discussed in different countries, and the kinds of biases which different types of sources present.
