AY 2022 Spring Semester • Full Year Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University (APU) Student Exchange Program Application Guidelines

*This guideline is an English version for students in the College of International Relations Global Studies Major

/ College of Policy Science Community and Regional Policy Studies Major

Through this program Ritsumeikan University (RU) and Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University (APU) aim to mutually enhance their curricula by leveraging the distinct merits of their respective educational systems.

In this program, RU students can study at APU as a "special auditing student" for one year or one semester. Students can pursue their diverse academic interests and satiate their intellectual curiosity by studying at APU and through interaction with APU students.

The exchange term at APU will be counted as part of your total period of university enrollment, and credits earned at APU are generally transferred as credits required for graduation at your affiliated College.

8. Transferred Credits

- Only credits earned for courses with a grade of A+, A, B, or C at APU can be transferred as an "T" grade at your College. ("F" grades will NOT be transferred.)
- Courses certified as having the same content as a course from your college can be transferred as the course of your college with a "T" grade.
- For any general education course or core related course, courses NOT certified as having the same content as a course of your college can be transferred as an "APU Exchange Subject" with a "T" grade.

9. Credit Approval Limit

The maximum number of credits that can be registered at APU and awarded at RU are as follows.

^{*} Includes credit exchangeable subjects, credits approved at APU, while on study abroad, prior to university admission and at other universities (excluding transfer admissions and advanced transfer admissions). In particular, students who have participated in study abroad programs in the past and transferred credits should take notice of this.

10. Tuition

Participants will continue to pay RU tuition during the program, and accordingly, there will be no additional tuition fees for APU.

11. Courses at APU

Participants will take courses of the AY 2017 curriculum either of College of Asia Pacific Studies (APS) or College of International Management (APM). Generally, all courses can be taken if they do not meet the restrictions below.

[Other Course Registration Restrictions]

- Language courses (English)
 Only the Language for Specific Purposes courses in the Standard Track can be taken.
- Asia Pacific languages (AP languages)
 APU offers "Asia Pacific Language" courses in six languages: Chinese, Korean, Malay-Indonesian, Spanish,
 Thai, and Vietnamese. These can be taken only if there are seats available.
- Language courses of the participant's native language: Not allowed.
- Courses in specialized subjects taught in English:
 In order to take courses in specialized subjects taught in English, language abilities equivalent to or greater than the following is required:
 - TOEFL ITP ® Test / TOEFL-PBT ® Test 480
 - TOEFL iBT ® Test 54
- For students studying at APU in the Spring Semester can take Summer Session courses. Students studying at APU for a full year can take Summer Session courses and Winter Session courses.
- 3rd year seminar

The instructor of the 3rd year seminar courses must authorize the student to take the course or not based on the application.

12. Accommodation

A student dormitory (AP House 3 or AP House 4) is available to students. (AP House 4 is NOT available for full year exchange student.) Please fill in your priority in the application form if you are applying for entering the dormitory. Your entry to the dormitory will be announced along with the acceptance to the program.

Participants must pay the total fees and expenses in one lump sum payment before starting the program. Monthly payments are not accepted.

AP House 3

It is located 10 minutes by bus from APU and 5 minutes walk from Kamegawa Shotengai (Kamegawa shopping area). A dormitory manager is stationed there 24 hours a day in order to help provide a safe and secure living environment. Nearest bus stop: Sekinoe-Kaisuiyokujo-mae (5 min walk)

Spring Semester (March 25 – July 31) $\frac{1}{2}$ 28,000 \times 4 months = $\frac{1}{2}$ 112,000

Full year (March 25 – February 15) $\frac{10.5}{10.5}$ months = $\frac{10.5}{10.5}$ months

- * Electric usage fee (about 7,000 yen / month) is required to pay the actual expenses separately from the rent. Kyushu Electric Power and the resident will contract directly by the day before entering the dormitory. Details of the procedure will be explained in the orientation for accepted students.
- * Every month, the 15th is the retirement dormitory date. Once past the 15 days is required dormitory of one month.

AP House 4

It is located 30 minutes by bus from APU and 10 minutes walk from Beppu station. A dormitory manager is stationed there 24 hours a day in order to help provide a safe and secure living environment. Nearest bus stop: Kyo-machi (3 min walk)

Spring Semester (March 25 – July 31) $\frac{49,000 \times 4}{49,000 \times 4}$ months + $\frac{433,000}{4000}$ (Entrance fee) = $\frac{4229,000}{4000}$ Full year (March 25 – February 15) $\frac{449,000 \times 10.5}{49,000 \times 10.5}$ months + $\frac{433,000}{4000}$ (Entrance fee) = $\frac{4547,500}{4000}$ If there are too many students who wish to live in the dormitory for one year, the students will be selected by lottery.

- * Electric usage fee is included in the fee above.
- * Entrance fee covers move-out inspection and cleaning.
- * Every month, the 15th is the retirement dormitory date. Once past the 15 days is required dormitory of one month.

13. Scholarship

"Ritsumeikan University Study Abroad Challenge Scholarship"

This scholarship encourages students to participate in and complete the program by subsidizing part of the participation costs. The scholarship will be awarded to those who are sent to this program and who apply for the "Study Abroad Challenge Scholarship".

(1) Application Procedures for the Scholarship

Application guidelines for the scholarship will be distributed at the Orientation for Accepted Students.

(2) Amount/When/How

The amount, time and method of awarding the scholarship for the program participants in the AY2022 spring semester and full year, are planned as follows.

(3) Points to note when receiving the scholarship

- 1. If you are receiving or expecting to receive other scholarships from institutions or organizations on or off campus, please consult with Kinugasa Manabi Station before applying for this scholarship. You may not be able to receive this scholarship in addition to other scholarships.
- 2. If the student falls into any of the following categories, the decision to grant the scholarship may be cancelled in whole or in part. In such cases, the student will be required to return all or part of the scholarship that has already been granted.
 - If the student's participation in the study abroad program is cancelled or the period of study abroad is changed.
 - If the student is found to have misrepresented information in the application documents or otherwise been dishonest.
 - If the student no longer meets the requirements for this scholarship.
- 3. If this program (on-site participation) is cancelled or the contents of the program is changed (including a change to online deliveries), scholarships may not be awarded and the amount is subject to change. Students will be notified of such changes of the policy.

14. Student Services at APU

Participants generally have the same access to library services, club activities, and co-op services as APU students.

15. Program Withdrawal

Withdrawal from the program is NOT permitted after being accepted.

How to Apply

1. Application Qualification

Applicants must fulfill the following conditions:

- Undergraduate student in College of Law, College of Social Sciences, College of International Relations, College of Letters, College of Economics, College of Science and Engineering, College of Sport and Health Science, College of Life Sciences, College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, College of Business Administration, College of Policy Science or College of Comprehensive Psychology.
- Completion of at least one year of study at an undergraduate school before starting the program. However, students cannot start the program in their last two semester of undergraduate studies.
- When applying for the program, the students must have completed an average of 16 credits or more per semester.
- When applying for the program, the student must have completed all "foreign language courses required for graduation" that are required at the point.
- Students who have already participated cannot apply.

[Notes]

- We do not accept incomplete application documents.
- Students on a leave of absence and studying abroad can apply; however, they must attend the interview at RU.
