Interview Chihiro Hirama

In BBP Project Team's activities, the Project Team Student staff and teachers are relatively well known to the users of the BBP.

However, there are also administrative staff in the office who are working hard to operate BBP. We interviewed Hana-san of Kinugasa International Center.

What is your work in the BBP project?

BBP is a place for students to connect with each other, but it is also a place for teachers and staff to work together to create something new. While teachers approach students with an educational perspective, as a staff member, I am in charge of the administrative side of the project, making sure that all the rules and regulations are followed, and that staff and participants are learning from each other and enjoying the activities.

I think that BBP is a place where all borders can be crossed and borders can be eliminated. Therefore, I want to make BBP as a joyful place where everyone can talk about anything with each other as a single individual, whether you are teachers, staff, or students. So I give advice to students as an individual and participate in BBP events although I am not a student.

If we have a lot of participants who want to practice English or Japanese, I will allocate a language for each break-out room, so



sometimes we have Japanese students speaking in English with other Japanese students. I think that is marvelous.

What are your hobbies?

My hobby is mountain climbing. Maybe, it is because I grew up in countryside and was surrounded by mountains. However, I started hiking after I became an adult. That feeling did captivate me and now I'm doing 3000m high mountains with heavy equipment on my back.

Have you lived in overseas?

It all started in my second year of high school when I decided to go on an exchange for a year, simply thinking "I want to speak English!". After that, I decided to continue my education in New Zealand and worked for a local travel agency. In New Zealand, I used to go to the beach a lot, and I think

Any advice to those who are thinking about study abroad?

I am Yuto, a 2nd year student in the Area studies, Department of Letters. I will introduce the deep world of railways in the column "Railway Journey". This time, I will introduce "rare scenes".



This photo was taken one day across the Kamo River on the east side of Kyoto Station on the Tokaido Line. This vehicle, which suddenly appeared while special rapid service trains and limited express trains were coming and going, is a new model of the Tokyo Metro Fukutoshin Line (series 17000).

So why are the trains in Kyoto?

Actually, this is in the process of being carried by train track from the factory that manufactures the railway vehicle to the depot of the railway company.

Railway vehicles can be transported by road, using trailers, by sea, or by train track, and one or more of these can be used. It will be shipped in combination.

When transporting by train track as shown in the photo, it is transported by being pulled by the locomotive of a freight train.

It has become a popular target for railway fans because it is the "first and last opportunity" for new rolling stock to travel on routes that would not normally appear when connected to a locomotive. Such trains occasionally run on the Tokaido Line and San-yo Line. It would be very lucky to see a vehicle you had never seen being pulled by a locomotive. Maybe there is something good on that day.
