Authors affiliated with participating universities/institutions receive...

- ✓ a 10% discount on the APCs*¹ (Article Processing Charge) for any paper published in an MDPI journal
- ✓ free, unlimited use of MDPI's online publication system, Susy*2
- ✓ a 10% discount on Book Processing Charges for MDPI books
- ✓ 12% off of English editing services

*1 APC: Article Processing Charge

This fee covers the cost of performing peer review, professional editing work, journal management, and other work required to maintain an academic publisher for each open access paper. The APC varies depending on the journal. For further information, please see here.


*2 SuSy: MDPI's proprietary online submission system

By using SuSy librarians can...

- •View all the information of articles submitted after 2010 and have it outputted as a CSV file. This includes data on the authors, corresponding authors, submission date, subjects, text, etc.
- Have a one-stop centralized management site to check the current status of their manuscripts in the publication process and receive alerts when a paper is accepted or published (alerts can be toggled on or off)
- ·Select for payment of their APCs (invoices can be bundled and paid in bulk or issued on the same day each month)
- •Receive automated deposits of papers from affiliated authors to the institutional repository (Deposits are made in a standard format using the SWORD 1.3 protocol) * Option

FAQ

Q1: Does it cost money for an institution to become a participating member?

— No. Participating in the IOAP is completely free with and comes with no hidden terms or conditions. Participating institutions can cancel at any time.

Q2: Are there any limits to which journals can have the 10% APC discount applied?

— No. Authors affiliated with participating universities receive a 10% discount on the APCs for any paper published in any MDPI journal.

Q3: Is there a limit to the number of manuscripts that can be submitted?

— No. No matter how many manuscripts an author submits, the 10% discount on APCs applies as long as they are affiliated with a participating institution. Furthermore, there is no minimum number of manuscripts that a participating institution has to submit either.

Q4: Does the 10% discount on APCs only apply if the affiliated author is the corresponding (main) author?

— No. As long as one of the authors of a manuscript is an affiliated author, the 10% discount will apply.

Q5: I have other discount vouchers. Can these be used with the 10% discount on APCs?

— No. Only one discount through an IOAP scheme is permitted per paper, and the discount cannot be combined with other available discounts (e.g., discount vouchers, or society membership discounts).

Q6: How are authors from affiliated institutions or universities identified?

— When a paper is submitted, it is automatically matched to an IOAP participant based on the email address. Authors are asked to confirm the choice, or select an institution if none was found. MDPI staff verify each selection as part of the initial screening of submitted papers.
