Beyond the architectural and cultural heritage, Bordeaux has become an influential and attractive metropolis.

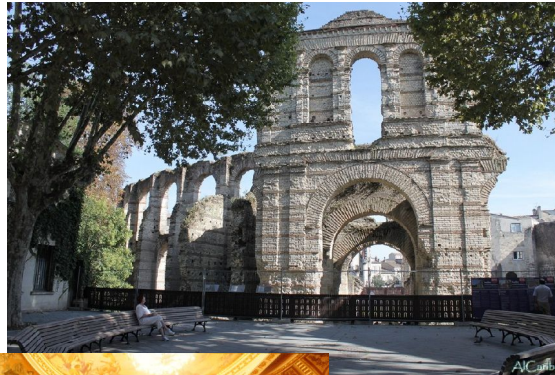
- **UNESCO World Heritage Site** since 2007

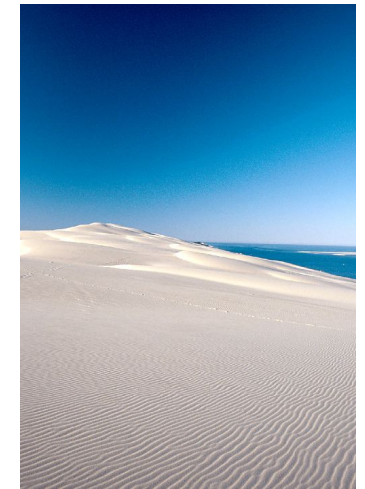


BEAUTIFUL SUROUNDINGS...

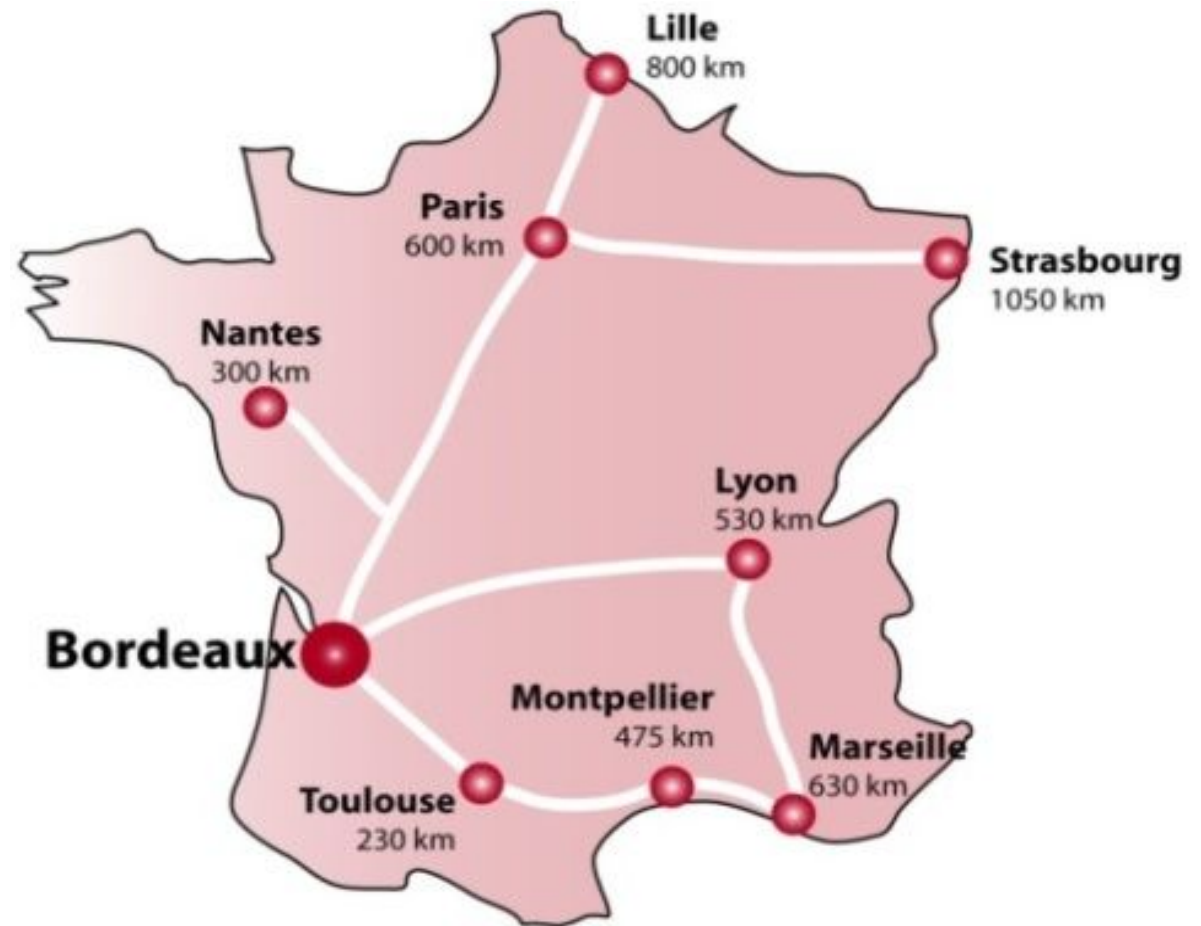
ACCESS

As the economic capital of South-Western France, Bordeaux can be easily reached by **air, train and road**.

- **Bordeaux International Airport**

- **High speed train**

BY AIR

With its **international airport**, Bordeaux is connected to the rest of the world through 5 of the biggest European hubs:

- **Paris** Charles de Gaulle, 6 flights per day, 820 connections
- **Amsterdam**, 3 flights per day, 350 connections
- **London**, 3 flights or more per day, 150 connections
- **Madrid** and **Lisbon** (2 flights per day each): connections towards South-America
- **Rome Fiumicino** : 1 flight or more per day, 250 connections

Bordeaux-Mérignac international airport is 12 km from the city centre and 15 km from the convention centre. There are regular transfers between the airport and the city:
Shuttle bus: 30 minutes
City bus: 40 minutes
Taxi: 20 minutes

55 scheduled routes, 23 airlines, European airports of which 9 low cost companies are served by regular flights.

BY TRAIN

Easy access by High Speed Train (TGV)

Today Bordeaux is connected to Paris by TGV in 3 hours (25 trains/day). In 2017, the time will be reduced to **2h Paris centre - Bordeaux center** and Roissy Charles de Gaulle airport within 3 hours. The city centre is linked to the train station by direct tramway.

From abroad

It is also possible to come to Bordeaux from abroad by train
