Psychological Traits of Adolescent Females That are Enthusiastic for Subculture

One form of Japanese subculture involves "Visual Kei" bands. This study discusses the relationship between the adolescent psychological traits and experiences of fans of such bands. In this study, semi-structured interviews were held with three working females who had experience being fans of such genre. The interviews were conducted conversationally with one respondent at a time. Focusing on family relations, friendships, fan experiences, and self-consciousness, the interview data was arranged chronologically, and then storylines were created and then conceptualized. The results show that "Visual Kei" bands provided something akin to a refuge, with out-of-the-ordinary experiences and self-conscious feelings by the respondents also being part of the package. The function as a "refuge" refers to a place that played the role of an escape from both reality and ordinary life, with the traits of being a fan coming in the form of seeking an independent refuge. The out-of-the-ordinary experiences helped the respondents develop their own self-understanding and ensured psychological stability. As students and as fans of "Visual Kei" bands, self-conscious feelings emerged.
