Since their emergence during the 1990s, queer studies have provided an active method for scientific inquiry, opening up new critical frameworks and displaying an array of possibilities. In the field of sociology, queer studies have developed at the intersection with gender studies, whereas, the potentialities of queer reading haven't been fully articulated in a theoretical perspective in the field of literature, despite the consistent presence of queer particular, it seems necessary to rethink the application of queer theory beyond the discourse on gay and lesbian studies, to which queer theory has been exclusively associated so far.
