## 凡例

1. 水俣市立徳富蘇峰記念館(旧淇水文庫)所蔵の手 沢本H.Reeve版(1875)に記された蘇峰の書き込みを つぎのように分類して示した。

I 本文以外の書き込み、印 Ⅱ 本文の日本語の書き込み Ⅲ 本文の英語の書き込み Ⅳ 赤い不審紙跡 V記号のある頁 Ⅵアンダーライン・サイドラインのない頁

- 2. I 本文以外の書き込み、印はほとんどノンブルがない箇所に記されている。そのため◇以下にその箇所を記した。また書き込みや印は「」で示し、<>内にその筆記用具や印の形状を記した。
- 3. 日本文の日本語の書き込みでは、日本語の書き込みと、その該当ページと部分、書き込みの位置を示した。なお紙幅の都合により、Reeve 版の該当箇所をすべて示すことができないので、始まりと終わりの部分を掲げた。その際省略した部分を、改行がない場合は…、改行がある場合は……で表した。また日本語の書き込みは「」で、書き込みの位置は\*で示した。さらに参考のために、現在普及しているG.Lawrence版(1969)、及び井伊玄太郎訳「アメリカの民主政治」上・中・下(講談社学術文庫)の該当ページをあわせて記した。その際、Reeve 版はR版、Lawrence 版はL版、井伊訳本を井上・井中・井下とした。書き込みには番号を付し〔1〕〔2〕……と表した。筆者の注は<>に収めた。
