Examining the international community's response to the 1994 genocide in Rwanda

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the tragic genocide which took place in Rwanda in 1994. This lecture will examine how and why the international community failed to stop the genocide, despite its determination to “never again” allow such atrocities to be committed while the world looks on.

Dr. Charles Murigande is a politician and diplomat who has taken a number of ministerial positions with the Government of Rwanda. He has been serving as Rwanda's ambassador to Japan since 2011.
