

WHAT'S HALAL?

Halal is foods permitted under Islamic guidelines. In Arabic, the word halal means "permitted" or "lawful", and foods like milk, fish, vegetables, grain, and beef and chicken slaughtered according to Islamic guidelines are safe to eat. The consumption of pork, alcohol, and meats slaughtered in any other way are prohibited.

WHAT'S "HALAL" SIGN?

We have a great number of international Muslim students enrolled at Ritsumeikan University. They are not familiar with Japanese food and it is hard for them to distinguish which food is halal at the cafeteria. Now we use a HALAL sign so that everyone can recognize the halal food, choose from a variety of menus, and enjoy their meal!

This sign means

★Halal ingredients are used.

★Alcohol is not used in the process of cooking.

The background is blue!

This says "HALAL"
in Arabic. Halal foods coming to the Union cafeteria!

Halal food is safe for Muslim to eat. Even if you are not a Muslim, you are more than welcome to try the food.

The halal menu changes every week!
